UVA Press Announces New Architecture Series: Race, Place, and Justice

The University of Virginia Press is pleased to announce *Race, Place, and Justice*, a new series that will publish the latest scholarship on architecture, architectural history, planning, preservation, and design. Informed by critical heritage studies, this series will examine and address how aspects of the built environment derive from and perpetuate dissonance, inequity, and subordination, and will highlight individual and community responses to such oppression. The series will be edited by Louis P. Nelson, senior editor, and Irene Cheng, Charles L. Davis II, and Mabel O. Wilson, consulting editors.

As series senior editor Louis P. Nelson notes, "Race may be one of the least understood forces shaping the built environment, both in our interpretations of past buildings and landscapes and in contemporary practice. As recent years have made clear, this is especially true in the North American context. In launching this series, we wish to curate a space that takes this intersection seriously and supports work from a younger generation of scholars for whom race, and the built environment is increasingly important."

Inspired by recent scholarship surveying the landscape of slavery and subjugation in the Atlantic world, *Race, Place, and Justice* welcomes projects from new and established scholars and practitioners, ranging from single-authored monographs to multi-authored/contributed volumes to books aimed at crossover audiences.

The inaugural volumes will be published in the spring of 2025. The first, *Architectures of Slavery: Ruins and Reconstructions,* is a groundbreaking collection of essays edited by Nathaniel Robert Walker and Rachel Ama Asaa Engmann that documents how the transatlantic slave trade and slavery shaped the fabric of our buildings and landscapes,

and how architecture remains problematically entangled with the ongoing legacies of slavery. The second, *The Belgian Friendship Building: From the New York World's Fair to a Virginia HBCU*, coauthored by Kathleen James-Chakraborty, Katherine Kuenzli, and Bryan Clark Green, recounts the circuitous story of how a landmark of modernist architecture that seemed to extol European colonization became a part of the campus of Virginia Union University in Richmond in 1940.

Castillo, Matos. "Rehabilitacion Convento Las Salesas, Pamplo". *A.V.* (no. 271-271, 2025). p.30-37

"The project responds to the decision to group all the offices of the different municipalities of the Pamplona region in the city center, reusing the Salesas Convent- a unique abandoned building in the old town-, therefore avoiding a new construction on the outskirts.

The first objective of the project is to change the relationship of the convent with the city. So, a building that was originally part of the city wall, and that denies the relationship outside the wall, is turned around and opened to the city's new expansion area, linking up with the gardens and public spaces of the Baluarte (city fortress)." Dillon, Martha." Artificial Intelligence & Craft", *The Architects' Journal*. (vol. 251, Issue 03, 2025). p.24-29.

"Artificial intelligence has rapidly become ubiquitous in our profession, working its way into theory, into our software's toolboxes and into our lives. In fact, it is increasingly present in every industry. Al- something that in my childhood was hidden in sci-fi subcultures- has nudged itself insistently into our everyday lives as if it were an obvious

good. Technology is, of course, within us already; we are already hybrid humans and have been for quite some time long attended by anxieties around the implications. A mixture off ear and doubt about the consequences of an Al-saturated profession has led me recently to immerse myself in books and podcasts, resisting my natural response which is to reject such technological advancements." Gallo, Cory. "William 'Bill' Johnson", *Landscape Architecture Magazine*. (vol. 114, N0,12, Dec. 2024). p. 32.

"William 'Bill' Johnson's contributions to landscape architecture span nearly threequarters of a century and covered a broad cross section of professional and academic practice. When he was growing up in rural Michigan during the Great Dep®session, his mother used the term "whole doth" to describe relationships between people, places, and things that she considered real. The term is rooted in a time and place and is about understanding and appreciating authenticity, an idea that profoundly shaped Johnson's perspectives on design." (p.32)

Harquitectes, "Sede de Galenicum, Esplugues (Barcelona)". *A.V.* (no. 271-271, 2025). P.66-71.

"For its new offices, the pharmaceutical company Galenicwn purchased an industrial building very close to Barcelona. The building has two parts: a large diaphanous pavilion with a structure of pillars, lattice trusses and a north facing sawtooth roof, and an office block. There is also a central courtyard.

This type of building usually has a lot of space and light but poor shelter from the elements, making it expensive to heat and hard to organize especially in a company with 140 staff members, a dozen departments, and major short-to-medium term growth. The air must be 'hierarchized' in a climatic gradient, and work must be well distributed for organizational and comfort purposes. Since climate control for the whole volume is not viable, the project aims to improve the envelope to temper the precinct, which requires a pre-treated primary air renewal process for the active climate in the restricted work zones, a feasible option in these controlled spaces." "The European dream of diversity, openness, and inclusion systematically collides with the European night-mare of colonization, extraction, exclusion, and externalization-a narrative that is far from over. From now on it will be necessary, when confronting the three great challenges of our era: climate change, scarcity of resources, and social inequalities; to challenge anew the doctrines and politics of the production of space. For example, certain decarbonization strategies often lead to activities linked to extraction

and outsourcing; strategies promoting European resilience can have exclusionary effects1 as well." (P.215)

Knight, David, "Sidcup Success Story", *The Architects' Journal.* (Vol 251, Issue 03, 2025). p. 46-60

"The hybrid programs of Storyteller translate into hybrid construction; a story told in the folded geometries of a facade that wraps around its variegated interior. In fact, it is a self-supporting skin of small-scale Belgian brick, only 80mm deep, which, like the other building components, is slimmed down as far as possible to be lightweight and to maximize interior space within the constrained site while retaining its tectonic integrity. It stands upon a precast plinth that negotiates the rising pavement. This is one of a series of precast elements that resolve geometries and weathering while giving image and continuity to the facade composition, counterpointing a panelized character that allows movement joints to be visually integrated along its 68m length." Li, Lingyan, "Job- Housing Spatial Characteristics and Commuting relationship: An Analysis based on mobile phone-signaling data in Xi'an". *Journal of Green Building.* (Vol 20, N0 1, Winter 2025). P. 63-87.

"Occupational and residential space is an important element of urban spatial structure, which directly or indirectly affects urban traffic, regional planning, the real estate economy, and the living environment. Through theoretical research and the practical development of job-housing spatial relationships, the job-housing balance, spatial mismatch, and related problems thereby constitute the research system of job-housing spatial relationships.

From the perspective of social development, the balance of jobs and housing has become the established direction for many big cities to build a reasonable spatial distribution pattern of jobs and housing. Scholars have conducted extensive research on the urban job-housing balance, mainly involving the following perspectives." (P.65)

Mozas, Javier, "Urban Agriculture". Architecture + Technology. (Issue 61, 2025). p. 14-19.

"The story begins in 1922 when Karl Kohler founded a horticultural company in Hochbord, a former industrial area that is now expand-ing nine kilometres from the centre of Zurich. The next generation of the Kohler family continued to operate the nursery until 1980, focusing on a local clientele looking for quality horticultural products. Then came a time when the arrival of large distributors in the area made them consider a sensible and socially acceptable solution for their land. It is therefore admirable that a private land-owner has tackled the construction of a residential building with the same care and rededication "with which vegetables were grown in the past"01 and has also committed himself to adding an attrac-tive socio-cultural offer." Mozas, Javier, "Intentional Vegetation". *Architecture + Technology.* (Issue 61, 2025). p.28-35.

"In 1981, four years before his death, Meret Oppenheim was com-missioned to create a sculptural fountain for a square in central Bern. The resulting piece is an eightmetres-tall concrete and metal column encircled by a spiral of metal pipes that channel water to flow down the shaft. Without Oppenheim having planned it, the passage of time has transformed the work, covering it with layers of limestone deposits, moss, small plants, and even icicles in winter, blending the artificial and natural into a living sculpture. Between 1995 and 1996, Herzog & de Meuron built a workspace in Mulhouse for photographer and artist Remy Zaugg. Rust from the chimneys of an adjacent factory were deposited on the roof of the studio, which, as it drained away, impregnated the wall of the southeast facade. The process left characteristic ochre-coloured streaks on the concrete." (P. 28)

"Things are created by humans to serve them. Therefore, their measurements are in accor-dance with the body. In the past, human limbs were the natural basis for all units of measurement. Even today, we have a better concept of the size of sol). 1ething when we hear: it was so many men high, so many elbows long, so many feet wider, or so many heads taller. These are concepts that are innate to us, whose sizes are, so to speak, in our blood." (p.13)

"Traditionally plan as emergency solutions to accommodate as many people as possible, shelters today aim to provide a more personal assistance, with the purpose of accompanying each resident towards the social, professional, educational, and health resources that can help them rebuild an autonomous life. With this approach, the project, which includes a day center and a night center with room/or 100 women, pursues three objectives. In the first place, to generate a safe space separated from the city to guarantee privacy and security with a perimeter garden that fictions as a filter. "(p.204)

"In Italy, every square meter of land we excavate holds the remains of the body and deeds of a man who has lived in bygone centuries. Consequently, that land is sacred. The aesthetical and ethical current of our time, which does not spare architecture, has its origin in an unprincipled and instrumentalized interpretation of modernity, an insincere
