01:46:13 Yi Luo: Some key takeaways from this meeting include:

- Late Ottoman rule saw Palestine as an important province rather than a marginal one, leading to increased infrastructure projects like railroads to connect it. Photographs of these projects asserted Ottoman control over the territory.

- World War 1 was a pivotal moment in the use of aerial photography, cartography, and surveillance technologies to map and control Palestine by various powers. This laid the groundwork for later divisions and claims over the land.

- Religious iconography from Judaism, Christianity, and Islam was used to justify political interventions and claims over the Holy Land from different groups.

- Local Palestinian workers played an important but often obscured role in infrastructure projects under Ottoman rule, as seen in some photographs but rarely leaving behind ...
