Past SAH President **Ken Tadashi Oshima**, Co-Chair of the Japan Studies Program and Professor of Architecture at University of Washington, will lead participants on an immersive 12-day tour of museums, temples, buildings and sites in Kyoto, Nara, Awaji Island, Takamatsu, Kurashiki, and Osaka. Dr. Oshima led SAH's last tours to Japan, in 2006 and 2007, and we are thrilled for him to once again share his expertise and knowledge of both classic and contemporary architecture of Japan with SAH members.



Tour Leader

Ken Tadashi Oshima

Ken Tadashi Oshima is professor in the Department of Architecture at the University of Washington, Seattle. Dr. Oshima served as president of the Society of Architectural Historians from 2016–2018 and led SAH tours to Japan in 2006 and 2007. He has been a visiting professor at the Harvard Graduate School of Design and taught at Columbia University. He earned an A.B. degree, magna cum laude, in East Asian Studies and Visual & Environmental Studies from Harvard College, M. Arch. degree from University of California, Berkeley and Ph.D. from Columbia University. From 2003–2005, he was a Robert and Lisa Sainsbury Fellow at the Sainsbury Institute for the Study of Japanese Arts and Cultures in London.

Dr. Oshima's publications include Kiyonori Kikutake: Between Land and Sea (Lars Müller/Harvard GSD, 2015), Architecturalized Asia (University of Hawaii Press/Hong Kong U. Press, 2013), GLOBAL ENDS: towards the beginning (Toto, 2012), International Architecture in Interwar Japan: Constructing Kokusai Kenchiku (University of Washington Press, 2009) and Arata Isozaki (Phaidon, 2009). He curated Tectonic Visions Between Land and Sea: Works of Kiyonori Kikutake (Harvard GSD, 2012), SANAA: Beyond Borders (Henry Art Gallery 2007–2008), and was co-curator of Japan in Architecture: Geneologies of its Transformation (Mori Art Museum, 2018), Frank Lloyd Wright at 150: Unpacking the Archive (MoMA, 2017) and Crafting a Modern World: The Architecture and Design of Antonin and Noemi Raymond (University of Pennsylvania, University of California, Santa Barbara, Kamakura Museum of Modern Art, 2006-2007). His articles on the international context of architecture and urbanism in Japan have been published in the Journal of the Society of Architectural Historians, Architecture + Urbanism, Architectural Review, Architectural Theory Review, Kenchiku Bunka, Japan Architect, L'Architecture d'Aujourd'hui, and the AA Files.

If you cancel, the following charges are incurred:

- Written cancellation received by SAH **on or before August 2, 2019**: full refund for the fully paid program price minus the \$1000 deposit/administrative fee.

- Written cancellation received by SAH between August 2 and October 18, 2019: a 50% refund of the fully paid program price minus the \$1000 deposit/ administrative fee.
- No refunds on or after October 19, 2019.
- If you purchased a double occupancy and your roommate cancels, you will be charged the single occupancy supplement.
